Ice Rules

SECTION I: PURPOSE AND SCOPE

The following rules for the conduct and use of the facilities by club members, parents or legal guardians and guests during regular sessions have been enacted pursuant to the Constitution and Bylaws of the Winterhurst Figure Skating Club and have the same purpose as defined under Article II therein.

SECTION II: AUTHORITY

The Board of Trustees supports the adherence to these rules by all concerned and herein delegates the full authority and responsibility to administer said rules to the monitor of the sessions in progress. This includes the authority to refuse a skater the ice or ask a skater to leave the ice if any club rules are violated.

If the regular assigned monitor is not present, the Club Administrator or designee should act as monitor. If the Club Administrator or designee is not present, a current board member should act as monitor. If no board member is present, a parent should act as monitor.

SECTION III: GENERAL RULES

1. It shall be the responsibility of all members of the WFSC to be thoroughly familiar with the constitution and bylaws, to comply with them in full and to exemplify the highest standards of fairness, ethical behavior and genuine good sportsmanship in any of their relations with others. Any person whose acts, statements or conduct is considered detrimental to the welfare of figure skating is subject to the loss of the privilege of registration by WFSC in accordance with the procedure outlined in Article VIII, of the constitution and bylaws relating to loss of membership privileges, suspension and expulsion. (**Article III, Section 9 of the Constitution and Bylaws of the WFSC.**)
2. Skaters are expected to be courteous and respect each other. The safety of others is everyone's responsibility.
3. In case of accident or injury, members are reminded that a skater is not to be moved except by qualified rink personnel. The monitor is responsible for summoning help. The rink personnel will administer emergency procedures, call the hospital if necessary, and call the skater's family.
4. Observers should refrain from going out on the ice or standing next to the ice, near the entrance. The only circumstance which requires a non-assigned person on the ice is someone in training for trial judging or judging.
5. Observers should not enter the hockey box unless serving as the monitor nor communicate with the skaters from the rear entrances to the ice.
6. All skaters will clear the ice promptly at the end of the sessions. All skaters must be off the ice when the Zamboni is on.
7. Professionals should not be interrupted during a lesson.
8. No food, beverages or smoking will be permitted on the ice. The only exception will be that skaters may take water, in a sealed container, out to the ice.
9. No games will be permitted on the ice.
10. Skaters are encouraged to keep unnecessary conversation off the ice.

SECTION IV: ICE SESSIONS

A. ATTENDANCE

1. All skaters should check in with the monitor before entering the ice on any session. The monitor will take attendance of the prepaid skaters and determine the available ice for sale to others. All skaters must pay for their session prior to entering the ice.
2. The monitor will sell the available ice on a pay-as-you-go basis. The monitor will record the skater's name, the session(s) skated and the amount paid on the monitor's sheet and return the dated envelope to the club in a designated location.
3. The monitor will sell pay-as-you-go ice on a first come first serve basis using the following rules of priority:
 - a. After prepaid skaters, any home club member who is testing within one week on Winterhurst ice.
 - b. After home club testers, any other home club member.
 - c. After home club member, any associate member.
 - d. After associate member, any visiting skater.
